And it flies su-super fast, if the hill is steep!

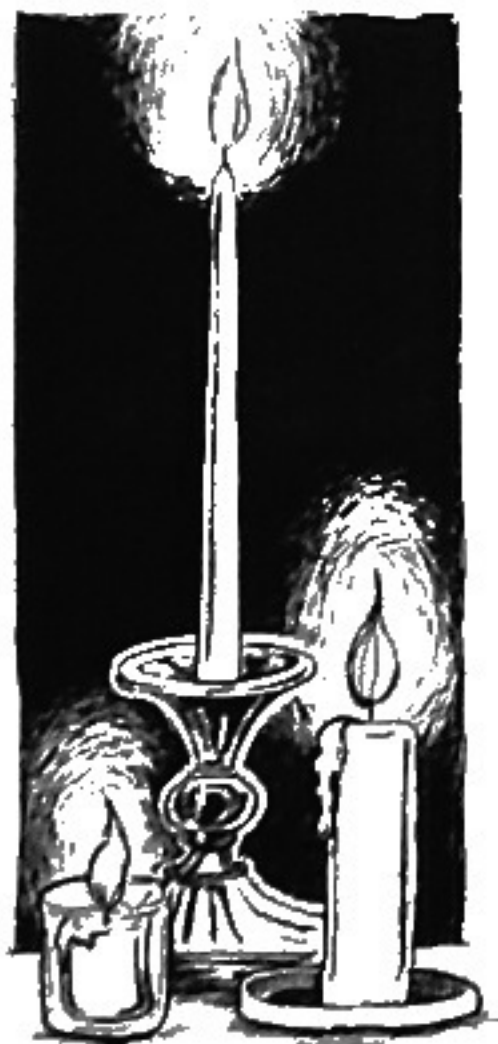
